

*******SOME MORE OF OMAHA*******

Omaha has a vibrant, revitalized center city and developing mid- and north downtown areas with a convention/event center, and the ballpark for the NCAA College World Series, which has generated the attendant bars and restaurants. Should you decide to venture about on your own, there is the world-class Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium; the highly regarded Joslyn Art Museum; Boys Town; the Durham Western Heritage Museum; Lauritzen Gardens; Orpheum Theatre; and the acclaimed state of the art, Holland Performing Arts Center that hosts the Omaha Symphony, and many big name acts and shows. Omaha boasts the eclectic Old Market, which has a variety of shops and eateries; and a plethora of famous steak houses, challenging golf courses, and casinos on the Iowa side of Missouri River.

SAC Aerospace Museum: (31miles-31minute drive from our hotel) Public tours of the SAC Aerospace Museum are given daily. They begin at 11 a.m. and are conducted by a volunteer staff member of the museum. Allow two hours for a full tour. (On occasion, docent tour guides are unable to give tours due to extenuating circumstances. Feel free to call the front desk [402.944.3100] after 9 a.m. on the day of your visit to ensure that tours will be available, or call in advance to schedule a tour). Old Market District : In the heart of downtown Omaha is the Old Market District, where a variety of historical buildings from the 19th century line cobblestone streets. It's a wonderful place to wander around, and some of Omaha's best and most interesting cafés and restaurants are in this area. Galleries abound, and their offerings are diverse, ranging from eclectic to more contemporary. The Old Market attracts locals and tourists alike and is relatively compact and well signposted for easy navigation.

First National's Spirit of Nebraska's Wilderness and Pioneer Courage Park (0.6miles from hotel) This free attraction is one of the most unique permanent outdoor art installations in the nation. Made of bronze and stainless steel, it is one of the largest of its kind in the world. Although the sculpture park is spread out over five city blocks, the installations are not adjacent. That said, it is easy to follow the flow from one piece to the next. The series shows a wagon train and pioneers making their way through hilly and muddy terrain, as well as a herd of bison and a flock of geese. The meandering procession terminates at the First National Tower. Visitors can walk right up to and around the sculptures, which are 1.25 times life size.
